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I took this photo on a **downtown** street in Tokyo.

Why do other people's voices, which are supposed to sound smaller than usual when wearing masks, seem so **loud**?

Closing the lens with my finger at the moment I pressed the shutter, many sounds I heard in the city stopped in an instant.

Sounds you don't want to hear can be muted in a simple way like this.

You don't have to see what you don't want to see.

It may be happier to escape from the hard **reality**.

But I don't think we should stop looking and listening.

We have to listen to the sound (= **voice**) of someone other than yourself.
